


### **NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE**

## GLT MEMBERSHIPS

### THE TIME HAS COME...

...to renew your memberships. Galt Little Theatre has three types:

1. Active- required by all involved in any capacity, whether on stage, back stage, on a committee, the board, or whatever. Active members have voice and vote at all general meetings. Cost is \$15.; forms are hanging on the bulleting board by the office.
2. Subscription- is the purchase of one ticket for each show, this season. Cost is \$55.
3. Patron- is the purchase of two tickets for each show, plus one active membership, plus a donation, for which an income tax receipt is issued.

To renew, please send a cheque to our theatre address, Box 1237, Cambridge, Ontario, N1R 6C9, or call 519-623-4070, or 519-653-9078 to renew using Visa or M/C. By telephone, you're welcome to leave a message, and we'll return your call.

Both subscribers and patrons may reserve the same seats for the same performance (ie. always the first Friday, or Sunday, or the second Thursday). Or, you may wish to call before each play to reserve your seats. The box office opens nine days before opening night; hours are Tuesdays through Saturdays, eleven AM to four PM. For Moon Over Buffalo, we will open September 14.
